- Discussion of the role of the Governor's diversity, equity, and inclusion staff person could be to bring diversity issues to light across the executive branch. May be a better goal and target than emphasizing the Department of Education alone

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 Discussion of education access data across the state as a result of COVID-19. Schools are working hard to facilitate access. Department of Education has distributed devices and worked

to assure internet access.

 Potential of partnering with a group to gather more information and make recommendations. State has partnered with NH Public Health Association, which has been growing and meeting

weekly. Discussion of sharing information and more intentionally collaborating with this group.

and questions arise about formalizing the arrangement.
