WHEREAS, Granny D recognized the importance of civic responsibility and encouraged people to practice their right to vote; and

WHEREAS, she was politically active throughout her life and called for honesty, transparency, and equality in politics; and

WHEREAS, she was also known for being committed to her fellow citizens, for working to advance the ideals of democracy, and for her love of the State of New Hampshire; and

WHEREAS, January 24th, 2020 would have been Granny D’s 110th birthday, and it is a day to reflect on her contributions and accomplishments in support of campaign finance reform;
