Legislative Subcommittee Update:

- Distributed updated list, but had missed SB 272
- Not a lot that needs to be addressed
- Do we want to be more proactive and involved about bills that make it to the Governor, both raising concerns but also showing support for bills that he has signed?
- Subcommittee proposes holding on determining what bills we would show support to until more bills have made their way through the legislature
 - Newer idea of making a show of support for bills that seem positive
- SB 272: Parental Bill of Rights
 - House version, HB 10, did not pass the House
- Bill for Rogers Johnson Portrait being heard tomorrow morning
- May presents an opportunity to address bills that are pending
- Re SB 272: Subcommittee has concerns that this may be a bill we should speak against
 - HB 10's original version seemed much more reasonable when compared to this version
 - Question of how to approach this in terms of the balance among the group – how much support should there be for us to act in response to a piece of legislation
- Helpful to provide the advice where warranted or to raise concerns, the sooner the better.

 - AE will reach out to the school administrator's association and see if they've seen the toolkit and found it useful or helpful
 - AM has raised the toolkit at events to bring it into the public eye
